Delicious bakeshop **Bitten** is breathing new life into the cupcake trend. Our fave? The Hans Rolo, a chocolate bomb of devil's food cake topped with the classic candy. Downtown Hamilton gets its "Brooklyn" cultural cred thanks in part to the scene on James St. North. Once a month, the neighbourhood art crawl (jamesstreetnorth.ca) takes over the streets for a festival of creativity, music and food. Galleries stay open late, and bars host local musicians as the action spills out onto the sidewalks.
