Some collectors claim they are preserving important artworks and artifacts for posterity. Others say this is looting. Internationally, museums and galleries face the daunting task of examining their collections closely and asking the question: *Whose art is it, anyway?*

T.N.T. brings together an expert panel, including Christine Forsythe, specialist in the field of intellectual and cultural property, Reinhard Reitzenstein, artist and Director of the Sculpture Program at University of Buffalo and Dr. Gary Warrick, Professor of Anthropology at Laurier University. Under the direction of Terry Cooke, the panel will examine the many topical issues surrounding museum and gallery collections and the origins and provenance of their art and artifacts.
