
Art for a Century: 100 for the 100th on view now

March 13, 2014— The Art Gallery of Hamilton is celebrating its Centennial with a year of landmark exhibitions. *Art for a Century: 100 for the 100th*, which gathers together 100 selected masterpieces from the Gallery's permanent collection is now on view. The major exhibition includes European masterworks by Georges Braques and Camille Pissaro, the Group of Seven and William Kurelek, rare contemporary installation art by Canadians Michael Snow and Joyce Wieland, and compelling African sculptures.

The cornerstone of the Art Gallery of Hamilton is its outstanding permanent collection, which is reputed to be one of the finest in Canada. What began 100 years ago with the donation of 29 paintings in memory of Hamilton-born William Blair Bruce, now numbers 10,000 works.

Chosen by Dr. Benedict Leca, Director of Curatorial Affairs; Tobi Bruce, Senior Curator, Canadian Historical Art; and Melissa Bennett, Curator of Contemporary Art, the

exhibition exemplifies the sustained level of quality in the collection's three core areas: Canadian historical, Canadian and global contemporary, and European art.

"This exhibition, invites viewers to wander, discover, and contemplate anew the treasures that will continue to enlighten for the next 100 years and beyond," said Louise Dompierre, President and CEO of the Art Gallery of Hamilton. "We never lose sight that the AGH permanent collection is held in trust for the people of Hamilton and we hope that all visitors will revel in this rich exhibition."

Occupying the entire second floor, admission to *Art for a Century: 100 for the 100th* is free, as the result of a generous donation from Orlick Industries Limited. The exhibition will remain on view until February 22, 2015.
