

KIDS A SPECIAL FOCUS AT ART GALLERY OF HAMILTON SPRING EXHIBITION OPENING

Family art-making activities celebrate opening of One-Eyed-Rabbit Sunday, March 8 from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

March 4, 2015 – The Art Gallery of Hamilton is extending a special invitation to families across the greater Hamilton area to attend the Gallery's Spring Exhibition Opening on Sunday, March 8 and join in the celebration of *One-Eyed-Rabbit: Jonathan Plante*, a rare exhibition designed especially for children. To mark the opening families will be able to share in the fun of artmaking, creating their own bunnies. The gallery will be open from 12:00 noon to 5:00 p.m. with free admission. Family art-making (also free) will be held from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

"We're very excited to present this delightful exhibition," said Shelley Falconer, AGH President and CEO. "Everyone is welcome. We hope that families will enjoy the experience of joining in the celebration of the AGH Spring Exhibition Opening."

In the story of the exhibition, the One-Eyed-Rabbit is an artist and the gallery is his studio. In a playful atmosphere and through the story of this friendly rabbit, Montreal-based artist Jonathan Plante invites young people aged 4 to 10 (and kids of all ages!) to (re)discover the mysteries of

visual perception in a variety of ways. The exhibition strikes a chord with viewers of all ages, because the One-Eyed-Rabbit is different. He has only one eye and would like to jump into his rabbit hole without chipping his teeth... He meets a worm that has no eyes but can navigate through holes in the ground! Together they will discover the power of imagination and the inner workings of sight: a little with the eyes, a lot with the brain, always with the heart.

"The idea of the one-eyed-rabbit came from the simple question, why do we have two eyes?," said Jonathan Plante. "The next question was what does it mean to see?"

The exhibition, which is designed and produced by VOX, centre de l'image contemporaine, Montreal, includes an animated video, original paintings, a giant book, and distorted mirror images that will stimulate the imagination of little ones and grownups alike. These unexpected and interactive aesthetic experiences notably address abstraction, art history and optical illusions. Through the various works, children are invited to discover the mechanisms of vision and the role it plays in the arts, while developing their imagination. Finally, a children's book based on the exhibition will allow readers to revisit the story of the *One-Eyed-Rabbit* for years to come (in French only).

One-Eyed-Rabbit: Jonathan Plante will remain on view through Sunday, May 24, 2015.

Also on view at the AGH Spring Exhibition Opening are *Illuminations: Italian Baroque Masterworks in Canadian Collections*, *Robert Burley: The Disappearance of Darkness*, *JUNO Photography Exhibition* and *JUNO Tour of Canadian Art*. Remarks will take place at 2:30 p.m.
