THIS IS SERIOUS: Canadian Indie Comics | June 21, 2019 to January 5, 2020

Canada is both a trendsetter and leader in global comic culture; this exhibition surveys the work of 40 artists and will be supported by smaller feature exhibitions on Inuit political cartoonist Alootook Ipellie and Canadian zine makers.



Milli: A Celebration of Style | Until Feb 9, 2020

A showcase of local entrepreneur and trailblazer Milli Gould, who has influenced five decades of fashion in the city of Hamilton and beyond.

In Residence: REITZENSTEIN | Until March 29, 2020

Environmental artist REITZENSTEIN presents installations and sculptures, as well as two collaborative projects exploring our relationship to trees.

Early Snow | February 1 to May 24, 2020

Michael Snow is one of Canada's greatest living artists who broke new ground in the areas of painting, drawing, sculpture, film, and music. This exhibition shows how his early work embodies his original, experimental approach.

The Artist's Dream: Works of French Symbolism | February 1 to May 31, 2020

Showing work from our permanent collection alongside works borrowed from collections across North America, this exhibition chronicles a key period of European art, bridging 19th-century romanticism with 20th-century modernism.

AGH Learn school packages are available Monday to Friday from September to June. Bookings are scheduled to start at 9:30 am for a morning session and 12:00 pm for an afternoon session. Adjustments can be made upon request.

Groups must be a minimum of 15 students to a maximum of 90 students per session. Smaller groups can be accommodated, but a minimum charge of \$120.00 applies to *AGH: On-Site Tour + Studio* programs.

The AGH facilities are fully accessible. Please contact us to discuss your specific needs.

School visits to the Art Gallery of Hamilton engage young learners through discussion and hands-on experiences. Choose one of the following programs as a basis for your half-day or full-day school visit.

ART STARTS 🚾



This program introduces our youngest learners to art, using the question "what do you see?" as a basis for teaching observation and communication skills. Our current exhibitions are inspiration for guided explorations of drawing, painting, stamping and sculpture during a series of art-making stations in the studio.

ART DISCOVERY WASSED WAS WAS US

This approach to a school visit will give students an overview of a selection of our current exhibitions, using them as a catalyst for conversation and learning about art and culture across time and space. This is a great option for teachers who simply want their students to "experience an art gallery" firsthand. This program can be adapted for all grade levels and used to connect to a variety of curriculum points.

Suggested Art Studios: Abstract, Landscape or Portrait Painting, Clay Portrait Busts, Wet Felting

ART + LAND WA ST EE WA COS (IS (S) EE

How can art help educate around environmental issues? How are indigenous ideas of land and nationhood reflected in the works of art in our galleries? This program will allow students to explore works of art that raise important questions about sustainability, ecology, nature and technology, and our responsibility to share and care for the land that sustains us. This program can be adapted for all grade levels.

Suggested Art Studios: Landscape Painting, Clay Sculpture, Wet Felting

STORYTELLING THROUGH ART WAS SS (1) WA WAS CONS (15) (E)













This program shows how art can tell diverse stories using examples of historic and contemporary art, as well as book-making forms such as comics and zines. Students will build visual literacy skills that will help them determine the sometimes hidden stories in works of art. Through conversation and observation, they will learn how works of art can help them discover some of the stories they hold inside themselves.

Suggested Art Studios: Printmaking, 8-Page Zine, Painting, Collage
