

This year's exhibitions and programs represent just a snapshot of who we are, what we represent, and where we are going. We hope that you will join us throughout the year, and that we engage your imagination!



# THE ARTIST'S DREAM: WORKS OF FRENCH SYMBOLISM

FEBRUARY 1 to MAY 31, 2020

GUEST CURATED BY // DR. AMY C. WALLACE

In their guest to visually express subjective ideas, Symbolist artists drew inspiration from dreaming in the development of their imagery and style. This exhibition explores dreaming as a metaphor for artistic vision in the Symbolist movement in France. It brings together impressive works of French Symbolism from the Joey and Toby Tanenbaum Collection at the Art Gallery of Hamilton alongside loans from collections throughout Canada and the United States. The selected works span fin-de-siècle painting, sculpture, and graphic arts to provide a picture of the movement across artistic media.

In addition to exploring the significance of dreaming in Symbolist art, the exhibition examines the personal and professional associations between artists associated with the movement. The representation of women as well as the influence of music and theatre on Symbolism in the visual arts are also explored. Special attention has been paid to showcasing the important contributions of women artists to the movement.

**Artists include:** Pierre Puvis de Chavannes, Jean-Jacques Henner, Auguste Rodin, Eugène Carrière, Sarah Bernhardt, Jeanne Jacquemin, Camille Claudel, and other artists associated with the Symbolist movement in France.



#### **EARLY SNOW: MICHAEL SNOW 1947-1962**


FEBRUARY 8 to MAY 24, 2020

GUEST CURATED BY // DR. JAMES KING

Early Snow: Michael Snow 1947–1962 is the first exhibition to focus exclusively on the Canadian artist's early formative years. Comprising over forty works and reflecting Snow's broad and diverse creative practice, the exhibition features an ambitious range of media including painting, sculpture, film, video, and works on paper.

Exhibitions and writings dealing with Michael Snow tend to concentrate on his Walking Women works to the exclusion of his earlier explorations: an important series of abstractions, major sculptures, and a breakthrough series of figurative studies. In concentrating on the artist's early work, Early Snow demonstrates how the artist's later career can only be fully appreciated when his formative years are examined and understood.

As such, this exhibition is devoted to the first fifteen years of Michael Snow's practice. The first work dates to 1947, when Snow was nineteen, and the last to 1962, just as he was leaving Toronto for New York City. By the age of thirty-three, his work had already undergone many metamorphoses, and this exhibition explores his experimentations and the accomplishments achieved during these crucial years.

A selection of works from the AGH collection explores the various aesthetics of Michael Snow's contemporaries during his early years in Toronto. A particular focus is on the artists who gathered around Avrom Isaacs's Greenwich Gallery and later The Isaacs Gallery, including Graham Coughtry, Dennis Burton, Joyce Wieland, Robert Markle, and Kazuo Nakamura

#### IN RESIDENCE: SYLVIA NICKERSON

APRIL 18, 2020 to MARCH 28, 2021

#### CURATED BY // MELISSA BENNETT

Local comics artist, writer, and illustrator Sylvia Nickerson will use her residency within the David Braley and Nancy Gordon Sculpture Atrium as an opportunity to develop content for a new fantasy adult-oriented literary graphic novel exploring the future of artificial intelligence. In addition to leading workshops that examine the major themes of the book, the artist will invite Gallery visitors to alter or add to narrative and illustrative elements, allowing the storymaking process to become a collaborative one. These activities will serve as inspiration for Nickerson's next graphic novel.

#### THE COLLECTION

ONGOING, WITH NEW ROOMS OPENING MARCH 7!

The Art Gallery of Hamilton has one of the most unique permanent collections in this country. In recent years, we have been reprioritizing our obligation to these 10,000+ objects, including our duty to highlight lesser-known works, position works in conversation with one another to encourage important social dialogue, and situate our galleries as relevant, deeply-interactive places of learning. New installations in 2020 will showcase the iconic Anishinaabe (Ojibwe) painter Norval Morrisseau, deepen investigations of land, identity, and narrative, and critically reflect on the function and formation of public art collections as a whole.

#### **WORKS ON TOUR**

THE AGH BIDS A FOND AND TEMPORARY FAREWELL TO A NUMBER OF WORKS PARTICIPATING IN IMPORTANT CANADIAN EXHIBITIONS IN 2020.

Summer is a busy time that will see two works by J.P. Riopelle head to the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts for the exhibition *Riopelle: The Call of Northern Landscapes and Indigenous Cultures* as well as nine modernist paintings by six artists, including Emily Carr and Marion Long, as part of the McMichael Canadian Art Collection's *Uninvited: Canadian Women Artists of the 1920s and 1930s.* Both of these intriguing exhibitions will subsequently tour the country into 2021.

On the international scene, *Mary's Permeating Sign*, a recent addition to the permanent collection by artist Tim Whiten, will be one of two of his works traveling to the University of Colorado Boulder's exhibition *Tim Whiten: Tools of Conveyance*, September 3 to December 18. James Tissot's *Croquet* will remain abroad through 2020, featured at the Musée d'Orsay's presentation of *James Tissot*, 1836-1902 in Paris from March 24 to July 19.

#### **MAUD LEWIS**

#### JUNE 20, 2020 to JANUARY 10, 2021

CURATED BY // SARAH MILROY

Organized and circulated by the McMichael Canadian Art Collection

One of Canada's most beloved folk artists. Maud Lewis was famous in her lifetime for her brightly-coloured and endearing paintings of rural Nova Scotia. Working from her cabin on the side of the highway in Marshalltown, in Digby County, she produced hundreds of small works that captured aspects of country life that were rapidly changing.

Until now, the story of her difficult life has dominated the discussion of her art: her triumph over her physical challenges and poverty, the harsh treatment she received at the hands of her family, and her alliance by chance with her husband Everett Lewis, who enabled her successful painting career over many decades.

This show, however, stresses the aesthetic aspect of Maud Lewis's achievement, looking carefully at her serial repetition of images and motifs across her career, and the dizzying variety that she brings to the problem of picture making. From her black cats and kittens, to her cart horses and oxen hauling logs, to her quayside scenes of ships in port and the Maritime landscape in all seasons, Maud Lewis made paintings that still delight in their optimism and buoyant vitality.



#### **POPPA WILSON**

#### JUNE 26 TO NOVEMBER 1, 2020

This is the first major solo exhibition in a public gallery of works by Poppa Wilson, a self-taught folk artist based in Vineland, Ontario. Embarking on his painting and carving practice at the remarkable age of eighty-one, Wilson has been producing vibrant paintings of trees, people, and animals for nearly fifteen years.

#### TOM THOMSON: THE ART OF AUTHENTICATION

JUNE 26, 2020 to JANUARY 3, 2021

#### CO-CURATED BY // TOBI BRUCE AND ALICIA BOUTILIER

Organized and circulated by the Art Gallery of Hamilton and the Agnes Etherington Art Centre, Queens University, and in partnership with the Canadian Conservation Institute. This project is supported by the Museums Assistance Program, funded by the Government of Canada.



Brushwork is one avenue of exploration in authenticating works of art. Are these brush strokes the work of Tom Thomson?

Tom Thomson: The Art of Authentication explores the myriad questions related to authenticating works of art. Without offering a conclusive yes or no, the exhibition is envisioned as a laboratory through which all of the various avenues of inquiry related to authentication are investigated and presented. Using three possible Tom Thomson panels as the nucleus, the project brings together approximately forty-five known sketch panels and canvases by Thomson in order to present a visual overview of the artist's practice.

The selection of paintings will form the basis for a series of exploratory themes key to authentication, including signature, provenance, subject matter, materials and technique, and stylistic analysis. Envisioned as a highly dynamic experience, the exhibition will be accompanied by a bilingual "field guide," and will include extensive didactic material including interviews and scientific findings courtesy of the Canadian Conservation Institute. The goal of the project is to foreground the fascinating detective work involved in authenticating works of art and in so doing make public the behind-the-scenes work museums regularly carry out.



#### **NORA HUTCHINSON**

NOVEMBER 21, 2020 to MAY 16, 2021

This exhibition explores the performative and video practice of Hamilton-based artist Nora Hutchinson in dialogue with a small selection of works from the AGH permanent collection. The artist will collaborate with the exhibition curators on selecting works she has produced over the past several decades, allowing for conversations around self-presentation in the context of second-wave feminism in Canada.




