



Radical Stitch Exhibition is Extended until August 27 at the Art Gallery of Hamilton

North America's most significant contemporary Indigenous beading exhibition has been extended due to popular demand.

The Art Gallery of Hamilton (AGH) announced the three-month extension of *Radical Stitch*, a significant exhibition showcasing contemporary Indigenous beading, during the exhibition's curator talk last night. The exhibition opened on February 11, 2023, being organized and circulated by The MacKenzie Art Gallery in Regina, Saskatchewan. The exhibition was originally scheduled to close on May 28, 2023, but due to the incredible response it has received, it has been extended until August 27, 2023.

"We are thrilled that *Radical Stitch* has garnered tremendous success and engagement here at the AGH. In light of the exhibition's importance, we have decided to extend it for an additional three months," said Shelley Falconer, President and CEO of the Art

Gallery of Hamilton. "We are deeply grateful to the MacKenzie Art Gallery for creating and organizing this groundbreaking exhibition, and for giving us the opportunity to bring it here to Hamilton."



All three exhibition curators - Sherry Farrell Racette, Michelle LaVallee, and Cathy Mattes - as well as exhibition artist Ruth Cuthand, were at the AGH for a panel discussion about the process of curating the exhibition. *Radical Stitch* brings together works from 35 contemporary Indigenous beaders, including Ruth Cuthand, Christi Belcourt, Shelley Niro, and others.

The works showcased in the exhibition invite viewers to immerse themselves in the political, creative, and aesthetic dimensions of contemporary Indigenous beadwork. In addition to the exhibition, *The Beading Room* offers a space for conversation, reflection, and sharing, and will now be extended to welcome Guest Beaders, who will host workshops and events throughout the summer.
