**123 King St W** I The AGH has been a fixture in the city since 1914, occupied many venues throughout its history and has been in its current location since 1977. It currently offers a multitude of presentation spaces, both within the context of its exhibition spaces as well as in its dedicated event spaces including the Pavilion, Fischer Galleries, and Sculpture Garden.

#### The Music Hall

**24 Main St W** I Built in 1868 as the Centenary Methodist Church, the Music Hall is a stunning example of Victorian-Romanesque architecture that now serves as a unique arts and entertainment venue.

## The Westdale

**1014 King St W** I A refurbished 1935 Art Deco single screen cinema that presents a mix of art and independent cinema with live performance.

## **Hamilton Craft Studios**

**121 Princess St, 2nd & 3rd Floors** I Located in a 14,000 square foot 1920s drawn wire factory reconfigured into a multidisciplinary craft studio featuring ceramics, textiles, and woodworking equipment.



# **Breathing in China: Art, Ethics, and the Environment**

For decades, China and the Global South have been definably impacted by smog, to the point of ecological destitution and human suffering. Guest curator Yan Zhou organized several artist exchange trips between Canada and her native China over the past few years, to foster the creation of new works that respond to the current climate crisis, specifically focusing on smog as a symbol and a symptom of our world in the time of climate emergency.



Fifteen featured artists explore the issues through remarkable and responsive materials, including drawing, painting, sculpture, installation, and video.

Artists include: Jean-François Côté (Québec City), Alexandre David (Montréal), Dong Dawei (Beijing), Xin He (Toronto), Ren Jie (Guangzhou), Gao Jie (Shanghai), Hua Jin (Montréal), Yam Lau (Toronto), Mireille Lavoie (Montréal), Li Ming (Beijing), Zhang Qingfan (Beijing), Xu Tan (Guangdong), Yang Xiao and Chen Sisi (Guangzhou) and Zhang Xiao (Chengdu).

# **Breathing Life**

As a part of the current exhibition, *The Breathing Project, Breathing Life* is an audio-walking tour that explores the exhibition, contributing artists, and air quality within and beyond the walls of the Art Gallery of Hamilton. With the ebb and flow of breath and the unrelenting question of what is in the air we breathe, the fluidity of the imaginary and the real find an audial counterpart: in the gallery, rooftop, King St, and beyond.

For her first major solo exhibition in a Southern Ontario museum, Farheen Haq (now based in Victoria, BC) recognizes the resilience and knowledge systems of her mother, a Muslim woman who arrived in the Niagara region from Pakistan in 1970. The exhibition examines intergenerational relationships, connecting Haq's mother's experience as a young Muslim bride arriving in Canada, with her own experience as a mother. Haq's work in performance, video and sculpture is a form of self-inquiry interwoven with an awareness of her family's responsibilities toward the work of reconciliation as settlers on Haudenosaunee territories. # Wonder: The Real, The Surreal, and The Fantastic

What is 'reality' today? What does it mean to be 'real'? Is there even such a thing?

In an age of reality shows, fake news, and weakened social and political structures, our sense of reality is quickly shifting. Neither fixed nor factual, our individual realities can exist alongside one another's and never meet.

This moment in time led to the idea of creating an exhibition around the idea of reality and sur-reality, or in art terms:
Realism, Surrealism and the Fantastic. This exhibition



explores the relationship between a logical view of life and the unconscious mind, fantasies, and the dream world.

The artists in this show find magic in the unexpected and the unnatural, the overlooked and the odd. Their work challenges values and norms in search of new realities and freedom. Here, imagination is front and centre and driven by the psychological rather than the logical.

Organized by theme, the exhibition brings together works by historical and contemporary artists who reflect and reimagine the body and the everyday in staging new and provocative worlds.

# RBC Artist in Residence: Melissa General



Melissa General is the RBC Artist in Residence for 2023, taking over the David Braley and Nancy Gordon sculpture atrium with an exhibition and evolving new body of work centred on her identity as a Mohawk artist from Six Nations of the Grand River Territory.

General is a graduate of the Ontario College of Art and Design and received a Masters of Fine Arts degree from York University. She is a multidisciplinary artist working in photography, audio, video, and installation. Her practice is focused on her home territory of Six Nations of the Grand River and the concepts of memory, language and Land. Her artwork has been exhibited at the Art Gallery of Southwestern Manitoba, Lamont Gallery, Plug In Institute of Contemporary Art, Harbourfront Centre, Stride Gallery, Gallery 101, Gallery 44 Centre for Contemporary Photography and has been included in the 2016 Contemporary Native Art Biennial in Montréal. She is a Hnatyshyn Foundation REVEAL – Indigenous Art Award laureate and was named as the 2018 Ontario Arts Council Indigenous Arts Award Emerging Artist Laureate.

# **Celebrating 50 Years of Hip Hop** with Concrete Canvas

Alexander Bacon and Moises Luvs are two generations of artists working within graffiti and hip hop, collaborating for the first time at AGH. Their aim with this new work is to depict the states of flow, a feeling that transcends and unites all the art forms within hip hop. The abstraction surrounding the character with headphones reflects the internal multi-layered transformative experience of being so deeply connected with your purpose and actions.
