The Art Gallery of Hamilton (AGH) was recognized for excellence in two categories at the 48th Annual GOG Awards, which were held at the Toronto Reference Library on December 1, 2025.

The GOG Awards were created to highlight the continued excellence, innovation, and importance of public art galleries, art museums, art centres, and art organizations. As the only annual juried awards of its kind, the iconic GOG Awards celebrate the outstanding achievement, artistic merit, and excellence of arts institutions and professionals in the public art gallery sector. This year's theme, **MAKE YOUR MARK – LAISSEZ VOTRE MARQUE**, focused on defending Canadian cultural sovereignty and supporting the arts as a public good.



Greg Staats: Runners Continuum was an exhibition of work by the Toronto-based artist which was on view at the AGH from February 22 to May 18, 2025. The show, which spread over three gallery spaces covering more than 3,000 square feet, included more than 25 works – some in photographic series and others in mixed media.

For this exhibition, which required more than five years of planning, Staats imagined himself in the place of the Hodinöhsö:ni' runner – a person whose role was to run over large distances to deliver important messages between communities and nations. He imagined the roles, responsibilities, and visual absorption of the runner in a time after the five Founding Nations were brought together in a Confederacy by the Peacemaker while carrying the knowledge of the Great Law of Peace, and the period before colonial contact.

Founded in 1914, the Art Gallery of Hamilton is the oldest and largest public art gallery in southwestern Ontario. Its permanent collection, which is focused on historical Canadian, International, and Contemporary art, numbers more than 11,000 works and is recognized as one of Canada's finest.
